 - The left side lists your classes, grade received, credits, and GPA for each year
 - The right side has courses YOU have taken listed By Department
 - The bottom right side has YOUR Credit Summary and shows what credits are still needed for graduation

- The average of all of your high school grades
- A = 4 points (4.0 GPA)
- B = 3 points (3.0 GPA)
- C = 2 points (2.0 GPA)
- D = 1 point (1.0 GPA)
- F = 0 points (0.0 GPA)
- **4-yr College Admission Requirement 3.0+ GPA**
- GPA Example: If you want a 3.0 GPA, you must make Bs in all of your classes.

Please review your credits still needed for graduation


When a student takes more than the minimum required credit amount in any given area, the additional credits automatically count as an elective. This is where the "+" comes from. Example: This student completed 2.5 credits of Practical Arts, but only 1 credit is required for graduation. The additional 1.5 credits of Practical Arts they completed counts towards electives.

Step 3: COURSE REQUESTS!!!

-Pink Sheets/: Class of 2023, 10th grade

-Green Sheets: Class of 2022, 11th grade

-Blue Sheets: Class of 2021, 12th grade

- Remember to include your name, current Advisor's name, and their room number
- Locate the box divided into 3 columns
- The first column is for first semester
- The second column is for second semester
- The third column is for teacher signatures for advanced and upper level elective courses
- Some boxes are completed for you. These are classes you have to take. **DO NOT WRITE ANYTHING IN THE CORE CLASS BOXES THAT ARE ALREADY FILLED IN, your current core class teacher will determine placement.**

Course Requests Cont.

- The remaining lines are for the remainder of your course selections (Fine Arts, Practical Arts, PE, Health, Personal Finance, Electives)
- The two lines at the bottom are for Alternatives, or back-up courses that will be placed on your schedule if one of your top choices is unavailable or conflicts with other courses
- **Alternatives must be different from your course selections and each should only be listed once**
- If you do not list any alternatives, your counselor will pick for you
- If trying out for a **special music course**, add it as one of your courses, but **make sure you list alternatives in case you are not selected**
- If applying for leadership, add it as one of your alternatives-it will be added later

Course Requests Cont.

- As you fill in your course request sheet, each line MUST have the official **course number AND course title** listed
- Students, only fill in the completely blank boxes and alternative boxes
- Be sure to check the online course handbook to see if a course is a year long or semester long course. If a class is a semester course, you only write it 1 time in 1 box. If a class is a year-long course, you write it in both semesters.
- Semester long courses may be offered first OR second semester

Course Requests Cont.

- Additional CORE courses can be added as electives
- Edgenuity/E2020 **CANNOT** be written in as a course
- The only classes that can be taken more than once are PE, Choir, and Band courses
- All rising seniors must completely fill in their course request sheets including those who plan to graduate in December
- Rising juniors and seniors on track for graduation can add Work Based Learning for one period if they have a job
- If a student is interested in taking one of the Summer Enrichment Courses (PE, Personal Finance, Health, Google Apps.), please have them check the box for up to 2 classes.
- If a student is interested in North Tech, please have them pick up an application from the Counseling Office. They should still complete the entire course request sheet.

Step 4: Give each student a Grade Level Course Offerings Sheet

- Grade Level Course Offerings Sheets (Students should use the course offerings sheet that correlates with their next year's grade level)
- The "S" stands for semester course and "Y" for year-long courses
- ***The asterisk (*) by a course means the course has a prerequisite, so you must check the handbook to see what that is to see if you can take the course.
- Students should have the same color Grade Level Course Offerings Sheet as they have Course Request Sheet.
- Course Handbooks should remain in the classroom. Students can access the Course Handbook from their bookmarks on their Chromebook.
