Home Learning Discussion Ideas

Consider talking about these topics during dinner or at another time during the day:

- What does it mean to be kind? How did you show kindness today?
- What are the beginning and ending sounds in our names? What letters make those sounds?
- What is your favorite shape and why?
- How many syllables are in our names?
- What are easy feelings and what are hard feelings? What are some strategies you like to use for hard feelings?
- What is your favorite story and why?
- Who is your favorite book character and why?
- Retell something that happened today.
- What are the stories behind family members' names?
- What types of books are your favorite to read?
- How do we show others that we are listening? Why is that important?
- Retell a funny family story.
- What can you do independently now that you couldn't do when you were younger?
- Give compliments to family members.
- What does it mean to show empathy? How did you show empathy today?
- What is an example of a small problem, medium problem, or big problem? How would you solve them?
- Can you break apart words into their beginning, middle, and end sounds?
- What does your body feel like when it is going too fast? What about when it is going too slow?
- What shapes can you see at the dinner table?
- What kind of changes do we see outside when it is Spring?
- What does it mean to use cooperation? What are some strategies you use with friends?
- What does it mean to show respect? How did you show respect today?
- What are your favorite foods? Tell about a time you tried a new food.
- How do you share ideas and toys?
- Write a letter for someone and send it in the mail.
- Help a family member cook or bake and read the recipe.
- What is your favorite season and why?
- What colors can you see from the dinner table?
- Take turns saying a letter of the alphabet in order. Try saying the alphabet backwards.
